

The Alamo Area Council of Governments is accepting nominations for the 2018 Regional Awards. Recipients will be honored during the AACOG Area Council and Board of Directors Annual Meeting on Wednesday, December 5, 2018.

Who is eligible for nomination?

Any person, corporation, community project, or government regional project that has contributed to the significant positive advancement of the region and/or any communities in the thirteen counties of the Alamo Area (Atascosa, Bandera, Bexar, Comal, Frio, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Karnes, Kendall, Kerr, McMullen, Medina, and Wilson counties) is eligible for nomination. Current elected officials and public sector employees are ineligible for nomination, unless directly involved in a governmental regional project.

Nomination categories

- Regional Citizen of the Year
- Corporate/Business Steward of the Year
- Community/Non-profit Project of the Year
- Governmental Project of the Year
- Lifetime Achievement Award (Not Awarded Every Year)

	GOVERNMENT PROJECT OF THE YEAR This award honors government projects that have contributed to the betterment of the region. These awards are given annually to completed			
	governmental entity-based projects that have significantly impacted the community for the better. Projects not yet completed are inel. LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD
