## **AACOG MOD Amendment: Hurricane Harvey CDBG-Disaster Recovery**

#### **Local Infrastructure Program**

AACOG is amending its Local Infrastructure Program MOD to reallocate declined and/or de-obligated funds over \$100,000.00 from its initial Local Infrastructure Program MOD.

\$1,317,225.00 was declined by 2 counties (Comal and Guadalupe) and 3 communities (New Braunfels, Schertz, Seguin) in the AACOG region. These entities are ineligible to receive allocations through the MOD amendment. The funds will be reallocated based on the MOD Amendment.

# 2018 AACOG MOD: Hurricane Harvey CDBG-Disaster Recovery



#### **2018 Local Infrastructure Allocation = \$1,530,000**

Estimated \$292,775 used



#### **2018 Distribution Factors**

- Damage Reports = 50%
- Population = 25%
- Repeat Disaster = 25%

## **AACOG MOD Amendment: Hurricane Harvey CDBG- Disaster Recovery**



**2022 Amendment Local Infrastructure Allocation = \$1,317,225** 



#### **2022 Amendment Local Infrastructure Minimum Grant**

- Minimum grant of \$100,000
- 70% of the funds must benefit Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI)



#### **Proposed 2022 Amendment Distribution Factors**

- Low-to-Moderate Income = 50%
- Social Vulnerability (SoVI) = 30%
- Population = 20%



#### **Eligible Communities**

 In Comal County: Bulverde, Canyon Lake, Fischer, Garden Ridge, Spring Branch

 In Guadalupe County: Cibolo, Marion, Santa Clara, Geronimo, Kingsbury, New Berlin, Selma

• In Karnes County: Karnes County, Falls City, Karnes City, Kenedy, Runge, Panna Maria



#### **Eligible Activities**

- Flood control and drainage improvements, including the construction or rehabilitation of storm water management systems
- Infrastructure improvements (such as water and sewer facilities, streets, provision of generators, removal of debris, bridges, etc.)
- Demolition, rehabilitation of publicly or privately-owned commercial or industrial buildings, and code enforcement

Each infrastructure activity must demonstrate how it will contribute to the long-term recovery.



#### **Ineligible Activities**

- Construction of dam/levee beyond original footprint
- Government buildings (conduct of government business)
- General government expenses to conduct business
- Political activities
- Purchase of construction equipment
- Purchase of fire protection equipment
- Purchase of personal property
- Operating and maintenance expenses
- New housing construction

### **AACOG Activity**

- 2018: Developed MOD for Local Infrastructure Program
- 2022: Developed and submitted Community Participation Plan (CPP) for review and approval by GLO – November 3
  - Public Planning Meeting (November 10)
  - Public Hearing (December 12, Karnes County Courthouse)
